The restoration of the graves of Patrick Stirling, locomotive engineer, and two of his sons has been completed. We thank everyone whose generous donations to the appeal made this work possible.



Young People Create New Garden

A group of young volunteers, taking part in the Government-backed National Citizen Service scheme, has created a new garden from an unloved corner of the cemetery.



In August the 16-year-olds cleared the overgrown north-east corner of the site and planted shrubs donated by FoHPC, Stonecrop Nurseries and NCS itself

Meanwhile, the Memorial Meadow commemorating those buried in Public Graves in Section H & I came into full flower this summer.



War Memorial Bid

The Friends have submitted a grant application to the Heritage Lottery Fund to provide and erect a war memorial. It will record the names of all 109 men who lost their lives as a result of military service in the two world wars and who are buried in Hyde Park Cemetery. We are awaiting the outcome of our bid.


New Street Boundary Improvements

As reported in a previous FoHPC Newsletter, the cemetery's western boundary, alongside New Street, is to be improved.

Doncaster Council will soon begin repairing the stone wall, where it has been damaged by ground heave caused by tree roots. The wall used to have railings built into it, similar to the exiting ones along Carr House Road (see picture below).



The Friends are planning to begin reinstating railings, as funding allows, beginning with a generous donation from a local benefactor. We are currently in discussion with the Council's Conservation Officer regarding the proposed design for the new railings. Planning permission and Listed Building Consent are likely to be required before installation can start.

Guided Walks Well Attended

Our most recent walk was titled 'Discovering Doncaster's Past'. It took place in September, coinciding with both Heritage Open Days and the St Leger Festival. Once again, excellent feedback was received.

Lodge Looking Good

Restoration work on the cemetery's former Lodge is progressing well, with the external work substantially completed.



The Lodge was bought by Adrian Welch Glass & Glazing in 2014. Since then, they have invested a significant sum in returning the Grade II Listed Building to its former glory.

Footpath Re-surfacing

Doncaster Council has recently carried out extensive re-surfacing of the footpaths in Hyde Park Cemetery. Some of the paths were becoming very uneven and potentially hazardous, so this re-surfacing will help to avoid any safety incidents for the pedestrians who visit the cemetery, as well as the many people who use it as a thoroughfare from Hyde Park to Balby Bridge and beyond.
