COMMUNITY FIRST GRANT

The Friends have secured a grant from Community First to construct a tree trail, erect signs for the Wildlife Area and Memorial Meadow and provide publicity for these initiatives.

Community First is a Government supported programme funding proposals that brings communities together for the greater good.

On the Working Morning on Saturday 14 March the Friends erected the two signs for the Memorial Meadow and one sign for the Wildlife area supplied by Jubb Signs and Ironcraft.

To follow are a tree sculpture of an owl and signs identifying 12 species of trees growing in the cemetery grounds.


The next newsletter will feature further information about the opening of the tree trail.




Patrick Stirling Locomotive Superintendent Great Northern Railway

The appeal for the restoration of the graves of Patrick Stirling and his sons has received generous donations of £350 from Wabtec Rail Ltd, £232 from Doncaster Tourist Information Centre and £100 from the Great Northern Railway Society.

Wabtec occupy the former GNR Doncaster Works where Mr Stirling spent almost 30 years of his life and where his famous Stirling Single locomotive was designed and built.

In addition to the corporate donations, many private individuals, including descendants of Mr Stirling himself, have donated substantial sums, taking the current total past £1200.



THE LODGE

Adrian Welch, who has been a great supporter of Friends of Hyde Park Cemetery, has purchased the lodge which is being refurbished inside and out for office accommodation for the adjacent glass operation.

Work should be completed later in the year and, once again, this once derelict lodge will be a great asset to the cemetery in particular and the town of Doncaster in general.
