
## Joseph (Joe) and Mary Alice Duddington

## Joe Duddington

Joseph (Joe) Duddington was born in Doncaster in 1876. His father Thomas worked as a railway fireman and Joe followed him into the railway industry. Joe married Mary Alice Lane in December 1900 at Christ Church, Doncaster. The couple lived together with their children in Doncaster. Mary Alice died in 1921 at 103 Catherine Street, the family home. She was 41.

Joe married Florence Goodlad in 1935.

On the 3rd of July 1938, Joe drove Mallard on its locomotive world speed record breaking run, with fireman Tommy Bray. Joe worked for the LNER until his retirement in 1944. In his later years he lived in Dunsville, Doncaster. Joe died on the 3rd of April 1953, aged 76.
